## DISPOSAL GUIDE FOR CITY OF CEDARBURG

A GUIDE TO SOME OF THE MORE COMMONLY ASKED HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS TO BE DISPOSED OF

PRODUCT	METHOD TO DISPOSE OF
Antifreeze Windshield wiper fluid	2 gallons or less, pour down drain w/plenty of water
Auto battery	Take to DPW garage during working hours or exchange at retailer
Brake fluid, transmission fluid Degreaser	Dispose of at approved hazardous waste facility (see Hazardous Waste Program Information)
Old gasoline/diesel fuel Kerosene	Dispose of at approved hazardous waste facility (see Hazardous Waste Program Information)
Motor oil	Take to DPW garage during working hours or place in after-hours drop box at the Public Works Garage
Fertilizer, dry only	Normal garbage with special wrapping (in newspaper, then plastic bag)
Pesticides, weed killers rat and rodent poison	Dispose of at approved hazardous waste facility (see Hazardous Waste Program Information)
Spackle, glaze, adhesives and glue putty, grout, caulk	Normal garbage collection
Latex paint or primer	Let paint dry out & put out with lid off can (putting kitty litter or sand helps drying process-leave litter in can when putting out w/garbage). Make sure to keep out of reach of children and pets.
Oil-based paint, stains, varnish, paint thinner, paint remover, stripper, wood preservative, rust remover	Dispose of at approved hazardous waste facility (see Hazardous Waste Program Information)
Batteries, alkaline (low mercury)	Normal garbage collection
Fluorescent tubes, bulbs & ballasts	Contact Beyer's True Value (262) 377-1313 for information on their lamp recycling program or refer to <u>www.earth911.com</u> for more information
After-shave, perfume, hair permanent lotions, cosmetics	If liquid, can be poured down drain with plenty of water. If not liquid, normal garbage collection.
Syringes	Seal in rigid, puncture-resistant, leak-proof container; seal prior to disposal.
Ammonia-based cleaners*** bleach-based cleaners*** disinfectant, drain cleaner floor wax/stripper, oven cleaner furniture polish, glass cleaner, spot remover, toilet bowl cleaner *** <b>Never</b> mix bleach with ammonia - a toxic gas may result.	If liquid, can be poured down drain with plenty of water. If not liquid, normal garbage collection Or can be taken to hazardous waste facility (see Hazardous Waste Program information)
